- **A.** All students must meet all the requisite diagnosis and procedures established by each clerkship, LACE 1 / 2 / 3 and the Critical Care rotation through patient care or alternate educational experiences.
- **B.** All students must meet each clerkship's standards for the minimum number of patients that must be seen.
  - 1. The following is the minimum number of patients to be seen in each clerkship:
    - a. Critical Care 25
    - b. Emergency Medicine 20
    - c. Family Medicine 7
    - d. Internal Medicine 25
    - e. LACE 1 16
    - f. LACE 2 16
    - g. LACE 3 35
    - h. Obstetrics and Gynecology 35
    - i. Neurology 8
    - j. Pediatrics 18
    - k. Psychiatry 10
    - I. Surgery 10
- **C.** All students are encouraged to log all patient encounters beyond the minimum standard.
- **D.** A student who does not complete the required OCE by 11:59pm on the final Friday of the clerkship will received an "Incomplete" for their grade. An

"Incomplete" grade will revert to a "Fail" if this requisite is not completed after one academic quarter.
